Dear Dr. Appenzeller,

We are seeking to have IAU Colloquium status for the conference described in the attached documents. A letter from Prof. B. Hauck, President, Commission 5 has already been forwarded to you.

The moral and financial support provided by IAU when the first Library and Information Services in Astronomy colloquium was held in 1988 proved to be invaluable. Our plan is to use this funding to defray registration costs on the part of participants for two distinct reasons. Firstly, this will help the participation of our colleagues from less-developed or redeveloping countries. We hope in particular to appeal in this very concrete way to our colleagues in eastern Europe. With sufficient support from IAU, we intend to support travel of participants from these countries.

Secondly, this colloquium will attract astronomers and librarians. Librarians generally do not get the same level of travel support, as do their scientific co-workers. We hope that the zero-level registration fee will prove to be very helpful for participation by librarians from astronomical departments and institutes.

This event is timely. It takes place in a period of rapid change in the way that both librarians and astronomers perceive of access to information. We would be very grateful for the backing of IAU for this colloquium.

## LISA-II: Scientific Rationale and Draft Program

IAU Colloquium No. 110, Library and Information Services in Astronomy (LISA), was held in Washington, D.C. on July 28-August 1, 1988. LISA II will be held at the European Southern Observatory, Garching/Munich, on May 10-12, 1995.

The aims of this Colloquium are twofold: (1) to provide the opportunity for librarians of astronomical observatories and institutes to meet to discuss common problems, and ways of stimulating greater cooperation between libraries and their services; and (2) to raise discussion about, and to throw light on, the interface areas between astronomical libraries and the wide range of online and other astronomical computer-based services which are becoming ever more widespread.

## Among topics to be covered are:

Astronomical information - changing technologies.

Impact of electronic publishing on the library.

Use of online databases - commercial and public domain.

Mastering the information flood - abstracting and indexing.

Future perspectives - major initiatives such as the National

Astronomical Library Research Initiatives.

The program envisaged will consist of one day of tutorials and hands-on training sessions; followed by two days of invited and contributed presentations.

## Planned tutorials and demonstrations (example worksheets to be provided):

Astronomical databases and other Internet resources - SIMBAD, NED, NSSDC, STARCAT, ESIS, ADS; other databases; publication-related resources, e.g. macros, indexes, tables of contents.

Astronomical library systems - ESO, STScI, etc.

Commercial information services, use of.

Document delivery systems.

Organisational issues - European; economically less advantaged countries; general.

#### Planned 'Birds of a Feather' sessions (informal meetings) to include:

"Digitalization of the Library".

"Electronic Publishing".

"New Media for Storage & Dissemination".

#### Planned invited presentations to include the following topics:

Theme talk "Changing role of libarians".

National Astronomy Research Library initative.

Information retrieval developments.

Hypertext and distributed hypertext: NCSA Mosaic representative.

Searching, indexing, information sifting and filtering.

Future perspectives for electronic publishing.

Document Management Systems.

Astronomical databases.

### Contributed presentations to be sought on topics such as the following:

Legal aspects, including copyright; thesauri; other Internet-related developments; integrating library resources and external on-line resources; integrating library meta-data and external meta-data (OPACs etc.); TQM, ISO 9000; Z39.50, ZDist and related developments; information market; publishers' perspectives.
