3. These events distorted NGC 1316 and its companions and also created many <b>shells</b> and loops of stars around it.	
3. The mergers also fueled a ravenous <b>supermassive black hole</b> at the galaxy's centre, 150 million times the mass of the Sun.	
5. Intense jets of high-energy particles from this black hole make NGC 1316 the fourth-brightest radio source in the sky.	
8. So not only is NGC 1316 a beautiful galaxy on the outside, but it also has wonders buried within.
